### **Dental Industry Support**

The use of xylitol to promote better oral health was approved by the FDA in the 1960s and endorsed by the World Congress of Minimally Invasive Dentistry. Xylitol studies were presented in 2001 at the Evidence Based Symposium at NIH. Presentations illustrated the effectiveness of xylitol and results from many studies were analyzed and found to be statistically significant. These studies show that mothers who chewed xylitol-sweetened gum could prevent transmission of cariogenic bacteria to their children and limit the risk for Early Childhood Caries. The study concluded that the use of xylitol-sweetened gum can prevent caries and should be “promoted as a public-health preventive measure.”
